Subject: Presentation of the *Liturgical Calendar 2024*.

Dear confreres, let us always thank God for all his blessings, thank him for this new year which is given to us and which is significant for the Church. In fact, let us walk together towards the conclusion of the Synod and preparing ourselves for the next Jubilee Year.

The Liturgical Calendar of the Order reaches everyone as a valuable tool to help us in the individual and community preparation for the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours and of the Mass, both in Religious and Parish Communities.

The Programmatic Document of the 80th General Chapter entrusted the new General Curia with two specific determinations concerning the Liturgical Calendar (nos. 12-13):

- enrich the Liturgical Calendar with a table that synthetically indicates the annual celebrations and pious exercises;
- choose a representative in each Province to collaborate with the General Curia in preparing the Liturgical Calendar specific to the Order.

The first determination has already been included in this volume (Appendix no. 4), while the second determination will be applied during next year.

Our Order is present in 8 different countries, each of which has its own Calendar, therefore, in order to make our Liturgical Calendar as inclusive as possible, we have preferred to follow as a basis the General Roman Calendar coupled with the Augustinian Calendar, indicating when there are specific celebrations of each country: solemnities, feasts, memorials, changings, additions, modifications, etc.

I would also remind you that the Liturgical Calendar is available in pdf on the Order's website and has been published in three languages.

I would like to thank the Director General for Communications for his compilation and drafting work. May the saints of the Augustinian family and our Venerables inspire us to live with depth and in communion the liturgical richness of the Discalced Augustinians.

The Members of a **Community**:

- Patron/Patroness of the House.
- Saints or Blessed whose body or relic is preserved in the House or Church.

Preamble no. 5

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

The can. 1249 indicates that: *“the divine law binds all the Christian faithful to do penance each in his or her own way. In order for all to be united among themselves by some common observance of penance, however, penitential days are prescribed on which the Christian faithful devote themselves in a special way to prayer, perform works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their own obligations more faithfully [...]”*.

The no. 39 of the Directory adds: *“a) Fasting and abstinence from meat on all Fridays of the year and in the eves of St. Joseph (March 19), the Annunciation of the Lord (March 25), the Conversion of our Holy Father Augustine (April 24), the Mother of Consolation (September 4), the Immaculate Conception (December 8); b) Abstinence from meat on all Saturdays of Advent and Lent”*, as a peculiar characteristic of a mendicant Order.

Paul VI makes the following distinction in the Apostolic Constitution *Paenitemini* (February 17: 1966), to which particular personal and health situations make exceptions:

- Fast: it is the obligation to have a single complete meal during the day, reducing the amount of food in the morning and in the evening; all adults up to the age of sixty are required (can. 1252).
- Abstinence: it is the prohibition of the use of meat in meals; all those who have completed fourteen years are required (can. 1252).

Proclamation of the day of Easter

Dear brothers and sisters, the glory of the Lord has shone upon us, and shall ever be manifest among us, until the day of his return. Through the rhythms of times and seasons let us celebrate the mysteries of salvation.

Let us recall the year's culmination, the Easter Triduum of the Lord: his last supper, his crucifixion, his burial, and his rising celebrated between the evening of the 28th of March and the evening of the 31st of March. Each Easter – as on each Sunday – the Holy Church makes present the great and saving deed by which Christ has forever conquered sin and death.

From Easter are reckoned all the days we keep holy: Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will occur on the 14nd of February; the Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on the 9th of May; Pentecost, the joyful conclusion of the Easter Season, will be celebrated on the 19th of May. The 1st Sunday of Advent, on the 1st of December.

Likewise, the pilgrim Church proclaims the Passover of Christ in the feasts of the holy Mother of God, in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the commemoration of the faithful departed. To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, forever and ever. Amen

From January 8 (Monday after the Baptism of the Lord) until February 13 (Tuesday before Ash Wednesday) is the first part of the O.T.

Beyond the times that have their own characteristics, in the O.T. there are thirty-three or thirty-four weeks during the course of the year, which are intended not to celebrate a particular aspect of the mystery of Christ, but in which this mystery is rather revered in its entirety, especially on Sundays.¹

Indications for Masses and prayers for various needs (Votives and Marian)

On weekdays in O.T. it is advisable to use the Mass forms for the various needs, votives and of the B.V.M.

Safeguarding the norms for the liturgical year, for the general calendar and for the Augustinian calendar, the liturgical texts, suggested for weekdays, agree with the biblical topic of the weekday lectionary, guaranteeing a thematic connection between the altar of the Word of God and the altar of the Body of Christ.

The Lent Season has the purpose of preparing Easter: the Lenten liturgy guides both the catechumens, through the different degrees of Christian initiation, and the faithful, through the remembrance of Baptism and Penitence.²

Indications for Lent

The weekdays of the Lent Season, from Ash Wednesday until the Saturday before Palm Sunday, prevail over the memorials of the Saints, which therefore can only be celebrated in a reduced form and can be celebrated as follows:

- a) In the Office of Readings, after the reading of the Fathers from the Proper of the Time with its responsory, the hagiographic reading of the current memorial with its responsory and the prayer of the Saint can be added.
- b) After the prayer, omitting the conclusion, the antiphon and the prayer of the Saint can be added to Lauds and Vespers.
- c) In the Mass of the day, the collection of the weekday can be replaced with that of the Saint marked in the calendar. Everything else is of the weekday.

The Alleluia is omitted in the Mass and in the Liturgy of the Hours. Gl. is said only on Solemnities, feasts and other special celebrations. The celebration of the *Via Crucis* is recommended every Friday of the Lenten season.

Indications for Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday, in which the Church begins the celebration of the mystery of her dead, buried and risen Lord, joins together the royal triumph of Christ and the announcement of his glorious Passion.

The Lord's entry into Jerusalem is commemorated with the solemn procession, with which the faithful, imitating the acclamations of the Jews, go to meet the Lord at the hymn of the Hosanna.

The procession is to be done only one before the Mass with greater participation of the people, or in the evening hours of Saturday or Sunday.

The faithful gather in a minor church or other suitable place outside the church to which the procession is headed. The faithful participate in this procession singing and carrying palm branches or other trees in their hands. The priest and the ministers precede the people, also carrying palms.

The palms are blessed to be carried in procession. Kept at home, they recall the victory of Christ celebrated on this day with the procession.

To commemorate the Lord's entry into Jerusalem, in addition to the solemn procession, the Missal proposes two other forms.

a) The first is the solemn introit that takes place when the procession cannot be made outside the church. It can be repeated before another Mass celebrated with great competition from the people.

b) The second form is the simple introit and is done at the beginning of the other Masses.

After the procession or the solemn entrance, the sign of the cross is omitted, the penitential act and the sprinkling of holy water that is used to do before Mass, and the collection is said immediately. The Mass then continues as usual.

The spiritual good of the faithful requires that the history of the Passion be read in its entirety and that the Lectionaries that precede it are not omitted. After the reading of the Passion, the homily, even if brief, should not be omitted.

In Holy Week the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation brought to completion by Christ in the last days of his life, beginning with his messianic entry into Jerusalem until his passion and resurrection.

Lent also includes Holy Thursday. From the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper begins the Easter Triduum, which continues on the Friday of the Passion and on Holy Saturday which has its center in the Easter Vigil.

It is good to dedicate the days of this Wk. to the celebration of confessions.

The rites of Holy Wk. can be celebrated in all churches and oratories. However, it is good that in non-parochial churches and oratories they are celebrated only if an adequate number of faithful participate, if there is an adequate number of ministers and the possibility of singing at least some part of the rite. Otherwise, it is fitting that these celebrations be omitted and the faithful gather together in the parish churches and in the other larger churches.

Indications for the Easter Triduum

The Easter Triduum of the Lord's Passion and Resurrection shines at the apex of your liturgical year.

The celebration of the Easter Triduum makes present and realizes the mystery of Easter, that is, the passage of the Lord from this world to the Father.

The celebrations of the sacred Triduum should only take place where they can be carried out with dignity and decorum.

It is very convenient for small religious communities to participate and animate the assembly of the faithful in major churches.

Indications for Holy Thursday

If the E.P. 1 is used, attention should be paid to the parts proper to this celebration (*communicantes*) which for convenience are reported in the Missal in the context of the celebration itself.

The faithful are invited to stay in church for an adequate space of time to worship the Most Holy Sacrament placed at the altar of reposition. The rules prohibit the use of the monstrance, the pyx is placed in a simple and dignified place.

Indications for the Easter Vigil

By very ancient tradition, this night is the night of Vigil in honor of the Lord, destined to celebrate the holy night in which Christ is risen, and is considered as the mother of all holy vigils. In fact, in it the Church awaits the resurrection of the Lord and celebrates it with the sacraments of Christian initiation.

The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil takes place at night; it must therefore either begin after the beginning of the night or end before dawn on Sunday. The whole celebration must take place in such a way as to preserve its nature as a prolonged vigil.

The celebration of Mass alone is not permitted without the rites of the Easter Vigil.

The Vigil takes place in this way: after the skylight and the Easter *preconio* (first part of this Vigil), the Church meditates on the wonders performed by the Lord for his people from the beginning (second part or liturgy of the Word), up to the moment in which, with her new members regenerated in Baptism (third part), she is invited to the table that the Lord has prepared for his people, as a memorial of his death and resurrection, awaiting his coming (fourth part).

The whole Easter Vigil is made up of symbols and rites, which must be performed with such breadth and dignity that the faithful can truly understand their meaning, also suggested by the monitions

. MARCH .

and prayers. Above all it is necessary that the faithful are guided with brief admonitions to understand the topological meaning of the Old Testament readings proposed in the Vigil.

As far as possible, prepare outside the church, in a suitable place, a fire, the flame of which is such as to truly dispel the darkness and illuminate the night.

The paschal candle, for the truth of the sign, is entirely of wax, unique, of considerable size, every new year: it must in fact recall the figure of Christ, the true light that illuminates the world.

The Easter preconcio can be announced, out of necessity, even by a cantor who is not a deacon, who, however, does not receive the blessing from the celebrant and omits the second part of the invitation “*And you, dear brothers...*” and the greeting “*The Lord be with you*”.

From the series of biblical readings of the Old Testament, at least three should be read, if necessary, at least two; never omit reading the book of Exodus (3rd reading).

The baptismal liturgy of the Easter Vigil reaches its fullness when the Christian initiation of adults or at least the baptism of children is celebrated. However, even if baptism is not celebrated, the blessing of baptismal water is done in parish churches; where there is not even a font to bless, the memorial of baptism should be made with the blessing of the water, with which the people sprinkle after the renewal of baptismal promises.

Incense can be used at the proclamation of the Gospel, but candles are not worn.

It is desirable that the fullness of the Eucharistic sign be reached with the communion of the Easter Vigil.

The fifty days that follow one another from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in exultation and joy as a single day of celebration, indeed as the great Sunday. These are the days in which, in a very special way, the Alleluia is sung.³

Indications for the Easter Season

Mass on Easter day should be celebrated with great solemnity. In it, instead of the penitential act, the blessed water is sprinkled during the Vigil, to recall the memorial of the baptism.

The paschal candle, to be placed at the ambo or near the altar, should be lit in all the major more solemn liturgical celebrations of this time until Pentecost Sunday.

Today it went through the entire octave, at Compline the antiphon “*This is the day*” is said, instead of the short responsory.

In place of the *Angelus Domini*, during your Easter Season, the antiphon *Regina Coeli* is recited

Up to and including December 16, in the Sunday and weekday Office, the antiphon at the invocation, the hymns at all the Hours, the antiphon at the Middle Hour, are proper to the Time and are found, in the book of the Liturgy of the Hours, at the beginning of the “proper of Time”. After the annual re-enactment of the paschal mystery, the Church has nothing more sacred than the celebration of the Lord's Birth and its first manifestations.

Indications for Christmas season

From the first Vespers of Christmas to the first Vespers of the Epiphany except, when it is not stated otherwise, the antiphon at the invitation, the hymns at all the Hours, the antiphon at the Middle Hour, are proper to the time and are found after December 24.

Christmas Eve Mass cannot be anticipated to the evening or evening hours (as for the Easter Vigil), but must be celebrated at midnight. Even in places where it is permitted to fulfill the precept the previous evening, in the afternoon of the 24th neither the Mass of Christmas Day nor that of the night is celebrated, but that of Vigil.

On Christmas Day each priest can celebrate or concelebrate three Masses, but not consecutively, and at the times corresponding to the three forms.

During the octave of Christmas the memories of the Saints are celebrated according to when indicated for the season of Advent.

Masses are not permitted during Christmas holidays votives of devotion, unless a pastoral utility requires it. Daily masses for the dead are prohibited. In addition to the Masses of the recurring Memoirs, those of the Saints enrolled in the Martyrology of that Day are permitted.

April 9, 1256: with the Bull *Licet Ecclesiae*, Pope Alexander IV approves the Great Union and establishes the Order of Hermits of Saint Augustine.

August 14, 2004: the Discalced Augustinians started a mission in Bandung, Indonesia, with the blessing of the local Bishop.

July 18, 2005: the 76th General Chapter extinguishes the Delegation and creates the Philippine Province of Saint Nicholas of Tolentino.

January 22, 2007: the Discalced Augustinians arrived in Yguazú, Paraguay.

January 20, 2008: the Discalced Augustinians arrived in Bamenda, Cameroon.

May 4, 2008: the Discalced Augustinians arrived in Da Nang, Vietnam.

December 15, 2018: the Discalced Augustinians arrived in Nalgonda Diocese, India.

November 21, 2019: the Congregation of Religious approves the changes made to the *Constitutions* after the celebration of the 78th General Chapter.

May 22, 2023: The *Ritual* and the *Ratio Generalis Institutionis* are definitively promulgated.
